Faenza is an ancient city of art in Emilia-Romagna; in addition to its ancient Roman roots, it features strong Renaissance elements. Moreover, the urban fabric is dotted by some clear references of its old Baroque splendour, as well as of the bourgeois elegance of the Art nouveau. Faenza is famous beyond the Italian borders for the production of CERAMICS. It's an art and craft tradition started during the Renaissance: the little local workshops have been creating unique pieces for more than five centuries. It is no surprise that the "maiolica" – the ceramics of Faenza – is called "faience" in most part of the World, and that, right in this city, the MIC – International Museum of Ceramics – hosts the widest collection of the world dedicated to ceramics. Faenza is only about 33 km away from Ravenna and its world-renowned Byzantine mosaics.
